A message from Mrs Bower

Parent Workshop – Wednesday 8th November 2.15pm – 3pm & 5pm – 5.45pm

We are running a parent Zones of Regulation workshop so come along to find out how we teach the children to self-regulate and how you can use these ideas at home.

The Zones of Regulation uses four colours to help children self-identify how they're feeling. The teaching of the zones helps children better understand their emotions, sensory needs, and thinking patterns. Children learn different strategies to help them cope and manage their emotions based on which colour zone they're in. Additionally, the Zones of Regulation helps children recognise their own triggers, learn to read facial expressions, develop problem solving skills and become more attuned to how their actions affect other people. We look forward to sharing with you how we use the Zones in school and how you can use them to help at home too!

The **ZONES** of Regulation®

BLUE ZONE Sad Sick Tired Bored Moving Slowly	GREEN ZONE Happy Calm Feeling Okay Focused Ready to Learn	YELLOW ZONE Frustrated Worried Silly/Wiggly Excited Loss of Some Control	RED ZONE Mad/Angry Mean Terrified Yelling/Hitting Out of Control

What's been happening this week?


Year 3
