We have taken the opportunity this week to make use of our


iPade to write the first draft of an email to Sir David Attenborough explaining why a particular endangered rainforest animal should be saved.

We have then learnt about subordinate conjunctions and clauses and been able

to improve our work more easily on the iPads. The children have really responded well to this approach. We will continue to develop their writing next week.

How you can help at home:

- Ensure that the children arrive for school on time at 8:50 each morning and that they are ready to learn, including coming to school with a charged iPad, their reading book and reading record. There are still quite a large number of children arriving late in the morning and receiving a late mark in the register.
- Most children are now logging into their iPads and educational software like veterans. However, some children are still experiencing difficulties with updates etc. Please ensure they log on and use their iPads regularly at home to help with this.
- Year 4 children are playing Spelling Shed really well now. We would also like them to go on TT Rock Stars as well. Remember there is a times table check at the end of this year.



We continue to explore our number system and place value in particular this half term. The children have moved quickly through rounding and will start to tackle negative numbers next week. This can be a challenging subject to understanding so some prior learning would come in handy. Visit
