

# Reading at AJA



### **Reading Lessons**

Pupils are taught explicit reading skills through daily reading lessons. Throughout the year, pupils will explore a range of age-appropriate texts. Each week, a consistent approach is taken that allows pupils to develop as readers.

- 1) Exploring the text; making links and connections.
- 2) Exploring vocabulary using the Alex Quigley SEEC model.
- 3) Developing comprehension skills.

### Phonics and other interventions

Pupils who still require Phonics teaching to support their progress in Reading receive daily Phonics instructions as part of a small group.

At AJA we use the Harmony Trust Phonics framework to teach Phonics.

In addition to Phonics, we also deliver a range of interventions to develop fluency, confidence and comprehension amongst our pupils.

- 1:1 Reading
- Echo Reading
- Repeated Reading

# **Reading for Pleasure**

The importance of reading for pleasure has been paramount given the implications of the research by Teresa Cremin on behalf of the Open University. The implications of this research are at the beating heart of everything we do at AJA.

Each classroom will have a welcoming Reading Corner that includes a range of high quality texts and acts as a social space to promote and celebrate reading.



# HTML in Reading

#### <u>MyOn</u>

Pupils at AJA have access to the MyOn Reading platform which is linked to Accelerated Reader. This is an online Reading library that gives children access to 6000 enhanced digital books.

#### Accelerated Reader

Pupils take computerised quizzes on books to test for reading comprehension. Passing the quiz is an indication that your child has understood what has been read.
