## **Spelling & Handwriting**

To develop pupils' spelling we use *Spelling Shed*. This is a spelling practice website that uses a friendly interface to encourage children to practise their spelling. Teachers' set pupils



Spelling depending on their ability and pupils who acquire the most points and classes who are most active are showcased in Celebration Assembly.

To support pupils with their handwriting, we dedicate time in the curriculum to regular handwriting practise. We use the Letter-join handwriting scheme which combines traditional and digital resources

#### **Environment**

- 1) Display the GASPE (Genre, Audience, Style, Purpose, Effect)
- 2) WAGOLL Text
- 3) Vocabulary featured in WAGOLL text.
- 4) Shared examples of writing skills that have been taught during the unit (Shared examples on flipchart paper)
- 5) Planning ideas.
- 6) Shared Writing examples.

#### **Assessment**

To monitor pupil attainment and progress in writing , we employ the following approaches:

- Teacher assessment of end of unit independent writing.
- In house moderation.
- Internal trust moderation.
